Action Plan Priorities

Producing and managing an Action Plan for the area is one of the key roles of the steering group. The second issue of the Partnership Times described who the steering group members are and what they do. The area Action Plan is made up of issues expressed and prioritised by local residents at the Open Public Meetings. At the moment the following themes are the main headings for our area Action Plan:

- Community Facilities & Young People
- Traffic and Transport
- Crime and Safety
- Environmental improvements

In this section of the newsletter we will report to you the progress we are making in taking forward the Action Plan priorities:

Facilities for young people:

During the school half term youth services along with local residents engaged young people to take part in a landscape project at the corner of where Meadow Vale and Thomas Pring Walk meet. Despite the rain there was a good turn out.

We have also managed to secure a further £2,500 to partly carry on with this project and also to improve the ruined shelter in St George Park.

St George Neighbourhood Partnership is helping to establish the Locality Partnership Executive for east side of Bristol, which includes St George along with Eastville, Hillfields and Frome Vale. The aim of this newly established partnership is to tackle issues relating to young people in a holistic approach. Locality Partnership Executive is made up of key agencies delivering services

for young people in the area. For the 2009/10 financial year the Locality Partnership Executive allocated £16,300 for Targeted Positive Activities (TPA). We believe this is not enough to tackle all of the concerns expressed by local residents, however, we see this as a starting point.

St George NP hopes to work with the Locality Partnership Executive to ensure that priorities identified by local residents in St George relating to young people are dealt with effectively.

To enable us to do this we would like to invite any organisation working with young people in St George to get in contact with us so we can map current provision for young people in the area.

Traffic & Transport:

We recognise many residents across the St George area are concerned about people speeding in their neighbourhoods. This was voted as a top priority in Troopers Hill and Speedwell areas. We are liaising with the Traffic and Transport team from the Council and the Police. However, due to limited resources and the scale of the problem when compared to other parts of the city, the kind of traffic calming measures we would like to see in the area are not going to take place within this financial year.

For this reason the steering group would like to be proactive in dealing with this issue. We are therefore looking for a group of local resident volunteers who would like to take part in a scheme aimed at reducing speeding in St George. Volunteers will be trained using speed guns or similar devices and would be asked to go with other volunteers and PCSOs to carryout speed reduction checks targeting "hot spot" areas. ensuring that local people are given a voice in saying what the priorities are for their area.

I moved to St George 11 years ago and think it is a great place to live, with access to the Green Flag award winning local nature reserve, Troopers Hill, St George's Park, Magpie Bottom and the walks along the Avon. My particular aim in joining the steering group was to help ensure local priorities raised about St George's green spaces were addressed. Neighbourhood Partnerships are a good way for local people set their priorities for their local services. This newsletter was created in response to the priorities set at the very first public meeting in November 2007. You can achieve more as a group than as an individual and the St George Neighbourhood Partnership is an effective means for local groups and individuals to join together to achieve their goals together with Bristol Council officers. I would encourage you to attend a steering group meeting to see how it operates and consider whether you would like to both contribute and benefit as a steering group member. HML Cup Final - Under 10's Nicholas Wanderers vs. Avon Athletic

Despite the lack of provision for young people in the area, there is a lot to celebrate about the achievements of young people in St George. We are pleased to share the success story of Nicholas Wanderers Junior Club in this issue.



The first game saw Nicholas Wanderers go 1-0 down after a swift move from Avon Athletic caught them unawares. Wanderers were swift to respond with Joe Han-Hauser's cross to Ethan Platts who cut in from the right wing and unleashed an unstoppable shot into the top right hand corner. Wanderers remained in command with solid defence from Jared Ford and Jordan Gilbert helping Owen Woodsworth keep the ball out of the net. The midfield saw good runs from Sami Karahan, Xavier Nicastro and Jaydon Liddiatt but they were thwarted by the solid performance of the Avon Athletic defence and especially the goalkeeper who kept them in the game. Even a superb Jordan Connolly cross could not penetrate the Avon Athletic defence.

The second game saw more Nicholas Wanderers dominance and a valiant defence from Avon Athletic. A quick break away from Avon Athletic almost proved costly for Wanderers but keeper Sean Marvin pulled out a superb fingertip save to keep the score level. Wanderers pushed on playing fluid, passing football and, after several shots on goal saved by the Avon Athletic keeper, their persistence paid off with a great goal from Callum Fudgell driven into the corner to the left of the keeper. A second goal came five minutes later with James Morton setting up another fantastic opportunity for Callum Fudgell to make it 2-0. Great defensive play from Terry Wise, Jack Josham

and Ryan Young kept the back solid; Jack Staples commanded the midfield as captain driving the ball forwards to Sam Delve & Sam Coole up front.

Well done to both sides who provided the supporters with a fantastic day and a game that was played in the right spirit by two well matched teams, but Nicholas Wanderers proved slightly the stronger on the day. Wanderers only disappointment was that their top goal scorer Kwyn Gilbert, who helped them to the final, was on holiday and not there to share in the celebrations.

Action Plan Priorities

Crime and safety:

At our last open public meeting local residents identified motorist speeding on Trooper Hill Road as a top priority.

Our local Neighbourhood Police Team are working with the Police Traffic Unit to carry out speed checks. So far no excessive speeds were identified. We will keep you posted of any progress.

Environmental improvements:

With the help of the Street Scene team we have cleared up eyesore bulky items from residents' front gardens. In total 5.2 tons of bulky item waste and a further 2 full skips of rubbish were collected under this scheme from Speedwell area. We have also put up flower baskets in front of shops in Maldowers Lane, Speedwell Road and at the roundabout where Speedwell Rd ends.



Concerns expressed by local residents about street cleansing times in conjunction with collection have been passed on to Bristol City Council Street Scene and SITA. We have been told this issue will be considered when renewing Street Cleaning contract with SITA. In the meantime Street cleansing in Speedwell area will take place Thursdays.

Finally the long awaited recycling plastic bottle bank has now been placed at the side of Meadow Vale Community Centre.
