

Results of Stepping Forward Consultation

Introduction

The consultation was run through distribution of a questionnaire both online and printed and through a range of consultation events designed to reach as wide a range of users of the hill as possible given the resources available.

Funding for the consultation came through a development grant awarded by Groundwork UK as part of the Big Lottery Community Spaces Programme. The results of the consultation are to be used to support a second stage bid to the same organisation to improve access on Troopers Hill Local Nature Reserve.

Online and Printed Questionnaire

An online questionnaire was open from 20/3/2011 until 8/5/2011 using 'Survey Monkey'. Paper questionnaires were hand delivered to streets adjacent and close to Troopers Hill Local Nature Reserve, with the majority of deliveries being made by 29/3/2011. Freepost envelopes were included for the return of questionnaires with the postage being paid by Bristol Parks and the envelopes being kindly donated by Modelmania. Further deliveries were made after each public consultation event where there were surplus questionnaires. 100 questionnaires were available for each consultation.

A total of 2,000 questionnaires were printed, 1,970 distributed. 30 remained after the last public display and consultation. As the questionnaire included dates for consultations it was decided that if these were distributed people would be annoyed that they had been delivered after the last consultation date had passed even though the end of questionnaire date was still in the future.

Number of Responses

467 responses were received, of which 392 were paper questionnaires and 75 were completed online. A member of Friends of Troopers Hill keyed the paper responses into the same online facility used by online respondents so we had a single source of compatible data. Some of the online responses were from people who had received the paper questionnaire who decided to submit their response online, so the response to the paper questionnaire exceeded 19%, an extremely high

response for a questionnaire. Other respondents online were members of Friends of Troopers who had been emailed with information about the Stepping Forward project. There are over 180 members with access to the internet.

Responses to Tick Box Questions

Over 95% of respondents supported improving the steps and paths, 94% were in favour of improving the access via Troopers Hill Field by making entrances and the area by the slide less muddy. Waymarking a woodland trail was supported by 86% of respondents. This means all our proposals have overwhelming support and there is sufficient information to go ahead with design and costings for the paths, steps, dropped kerbs and drainage.

For the woodland trail the majority of people wanted information on trees, plants and wildlife (78%) but this was closely following by an interest in history, route markers and identification of landmarks. The overwhelming majority (82.6%) gave "boards" as their preferred way of the information being conveyed but this does conflict with the oral input that any information should be as unobtrusive as possible and in keeping with the natural feel of the woods. This will need careful design. 18 respondents said they would like to work with an artist creating ways of presenting information and marking a woodland trail, 17 respondents said their children would like to do this. This totals 27 households who would like to be involved in the design process. We can now make very outline designs on which to base costings for the detailed design and delivery.

A summary of the responses produced by Survey Monkey is shown in Appendix A below.

Written Responses

People were asked to give their ideas for changes to improve access in a text box. 98 people gave their ideas, many of these related to general issues on Troopers Hill rather than access. These responses were categorised and this produced 56 categories. In the majority of cases each category only had 1 supporter. Categories with more than one supporter are listed below together with the number of their supporters. Some responses fell into several categories.

School Consultation

An individual consultation was carried out with a class of year 3 pupils from Summerhill Primary School . The results of that consultation can be found in Appendix B.

Community Events

At other consultations people were encourage to use coloured sticky paper spots and post it notes to make their comments and choose between Yes, No and Don't from ideas listed on the display boards.

The results are shown in Appendix C.

People were happy to use the spots but reluctant to use post its. Only 1 was completed which said - "CLEARLY show where the "Field" ends and the nature reserve begins and vice versa with a "gateway" structure/artwork".

Consultations were held at

- the meeting of the St George Neighbourhood Partnership Forum of Tuesday 22nd March 7pm-9pm. There were about 50 attendees, all adults ranging in age from twenty to over sixty.
- the very nearby St Aidans Community Fair Saturday 26th March 11am-2pm- we distributed 1500 slips promoting this fair within our first delivery of questionnaires. This was well attended and comprised a range of age groups from babies in pushchairs to the very elderly, Many families visited our stand.
- an individual drop in session on Saturday 2nd April 2pm-5pm. Lower numbers and mainly elderly people.
- a guided walk on Troopers Hill and in the woodland on Sunday 3rd April 2pm-3.30pm. A rainy day but this event attracted families with young children at primary school.
- a gazebo on the top of Troopers Hill alongside the popular open air Good Friday service held by a combination of local churches, Friday 22nd April 11am-1pm. Over 200 attendees of all ages.

Informal Feedback

Oral feedback during all contacts with the public about the Stepping Forward project gave four main themes that were strongly emphasised:

- improvements to make Troopers Hill more easily accessible would be widely welcomed.
- any signage/information displayed in or to the woodlands should be low key and unobtrusive to avoid detracting from the natural feel of the woodland and Troopers Hill.
- improved access on Troopers Hill should as far as possible blend in visually with the natural look of the Hill.
- drainage to Troopers Hill Field, which many people have to cross to reach Troopers Hill, is critical

These themes also reflect comments made to Friends of Troopers Hill prior to the submission of the first stage application that led to the application being made.

The matting we displayed at the consultation sessions, an option for placing on path and step surfaces, was generally approved. This matting will allow grass to grow through it or can be used to retain chippings.

Conclusions

Friends of Troopers Hill are extremely pleased with the overall level of support for the proposals and to see their own views authenticated by this consultation exercise. It is clear though that a very small minority of people (14, representing 3% in the survey) see any intervention on Troopers Hill as undesirable.

Some of those who support the plans, also strongly urge that care is taken regarding the impact of works on the site. Friends of Troopers Hill will ensure that design specifications and method statements for the work will include care for the environment in which the works are being carried out and an achievable objective of minimum impact on the site while still delivering improved access.

The results of this survey have also been shared with Bristol Parks who manage the site and will be considered as part of this year's review of the management plan.
