

A penny from Zambia for the slide

If you would like a penny, or halfpenny from Zambia just donate £5 or more to the Friends of Troopers Hill slide fundraiser via www.tinyurl.com/THslide and email friends@troopers-hill.org.uk to specify which coin you would like and the address, within 2 miles of Troopers Hill, to which you would like the coin delivered.

It will be delivered in a hand-addressed envelope and will contain a note saying

“This coin has been sent to you in recognition of a generous donation by xxx (*your name*) to the Friends of Troopers Hill slide fundraiser www.tinyurl.com/THredslide”

All the penny coins are approximately 2.7cm in diameter. All the halfpenny coins are approximately 2.1cm in diameter. They all have a hole in the centre as part of the design and all have a copper appearance.

History

The pennies and halfpennies were collected by the family of a Friend of Troopers Hill while they were on a Foreign and Commonwealth Office posting to Lusaka, Zambia from 1966-1969. Soon after they arrived Zambia decimalised their currency which

changed from Zambian pounds, shillings and pence to kwacha and ngwee. 10 shillings (which later became 50 pence in the UK) became 1 Kwacha and there were 100 ngwee to a Kwacha.

Zambia was Northern Rhodesia. Southern Rhodesia became Zimbabwe. Nyasaland became Malawi.

The Copper Link between Zambia and Troopers Hill

Zambia is a major producer of copper. The chimney at the top of Troopers Hill was used for copper smelting from around 1790 although the ore bearing rocks came from Devon rather than Zambia.

Value

The coins are not worth very much. They are put on sale on ebay at various values but rarely seem to sell. The family who owned these coins were advised that they could sell all 242 coins to a scrap metal merchant for the copper and would probably raise around £3 this way. They donated the coins to Friends of Troopers Hill to help raise funds for a slide on Troopers Hill Field. If two years after the appeal started, insufficient funds have been raised, the funds will be used to provide children's activities on Troopers Hill.
