Main points taken from all discussions with children

These are the points that came up on all the sessions

- The children liked the flat space to play games on and did not want it built over, many asked for football posts, and some even wondered if it could be marked as a football field.
- The talked a lot about the conservation area and what they do their, they were concerned about introducing to “plastic” things into the top field and wanted the play area to be wildlife friendly
- Climbing was their top thing to do; the all asked for various different climbing frames from cheap nets. Planting trees, boulders etc and the triangular climbing frames at Blaise Castle.
- The children liked the idea of adventure, or a place to have adventures, places to run around and hide

I asked if they had to make a choice between a small structure and swings /slides etc. or logs, boulders ditches and natural play, the answer was unanimous the logs boulders etc though many added somewhere to climb like a cheap net, or low trees
