- The site is used as a local dog latrine, and with the number of children who play there, this has to be dangerous for them. More education is needed to encourage owners to clear up after their pets

- The river along Crews Hole has lots of diverse wildlife. It is a popular walk BUT it is strewn with litter and the dog poo situation is apalling. Can you help?
- ["PLANTS there are more plants to be seen than those I have listed. I am still checking them out. It will be interesting to see next year what has been lost due to the fires that have left grass scorched. one of your greatest drawbacks is dealing with the yobs and their loutish behaviour. They have no respect and are out to destroy.

There was not a view exactly on a sunny Sunday morning but a dazzling white hint of a vista. I wanted to show my mother, who lived outside Bristol. She died unexpectedly that year so I never did.
